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



Best Practices - 1

Title:

Me and My English

Goal:

Language is our primary source of communication. It's the method through which we share our ideas and thoughts with others. As it is rightly said by Frank Smith "One language sets you in a corridor for life. Two languages open every door along the way." The aims of "Me and My English" language practices are :

- to enable the learner to improve both their ability to communicate and achieve linguistic competence in the English language.
- to develop a balance of receptive (reading, listening) and productive (speaking, writing) skills.
- to use the language in day to day life for self and social awareness.

The Context:

Learning a language is an art. It takes skill, patience, quick thinking, and discipline in order to perfect. Robert A. Heinland said that, "It was the sort of sword that felt as if it were an extension of your body". In the same way, language is the sword, which is an extension of the Mind. This sword will help to cut through confusion by expressing ones ideas clearly to others.

While the learner begin to use English language, they feel like a newborn child, learning to express himself again from the beginning. This can seem scary at first; because we soon realize that we cannot tell someone what we really feel in words. We have used words ever since we were young, and losing this ability again by speaking English –foreign language makes us experience all over these feelings of helplessness. But both good and bad experience in speaking will help the learner to value language, and became relatively proficient.

The Practice:

As with anything we learn to do well, once we get to a certain skill level, we no longer feel as if it is difficult; rather, it becomes a part of us.

The following are the steps taken to practice in learning the English language:

- > aside two sessions per week with the English trainer
- > to learn 10 new words a week
- trainer to help with pronunciation and meet once a week face to face or on Skype
- compile a list of jokes from the internet
- videos of the native speaker
- > record the learner speech and then compare with the original.

Evidence of Success:

- Their placement records in various English medium schools.
- Improved writing style in the examinations.
- Through their conversation inside & outside the classroom
- Their results help us to self-evaluate our practices and bring modifications if any.

Title:

Art of living

Goal:

The aim of "Art of living" a value education practice is:
